SUMMARY OF MEETING WITH CITY REGARDING STREET LIGHTS

On November 14, 2013 the Browncroft neighbors met with City officials at St John the Evangelist Church to discuss the installation of the new street lights. City Department of Engineering staff, Ned Kelley and Jim Mcintoch presented information and answered questions. The street light project will involve all Browncroft streets between Browncroft Boulevard and Blossom Road plus Quentin Road. Major points:

- The current plan is for installation to start next summer of 2014 and run approximately 8-12 weeks.
- A map was presented which showed the locations of the new poles that are replacing the existing steel poles. Poles will alternate on both sides of the streets. The present concrete poles will be replaced in their current location.
- The current plan includes 154 poles on about 15 circuits (presently there is only one circuit). The lights will be 40-60% brighter even with wattage reduction from the present 166 watts to 85 watts. The circuit will

be 120 volt.

- Poles will be added or placed to provide better lighting at certain intersections (e.g. Yarmouth/Dochester).
- Projected assessment for the street lights was \$0.84 per liner foot. The actual cost may come in lower. Final cost will be determined after completion.

More of the details learned from this meeting will be made available in the next newsletter when the project draws nearer.
