ZONING BOARD DECISION

On December 21, 2017 the Zoning Board of Appeals denied the application of the homeowner at 388 Newcastle Road to widen an existing driveway to create front yard parking. The vote was five to zero.

BNA and a number of residents, by letter and in person, requested that the variance be denied because it would have set an unwanted precedent, the paving of the shared driveway would not produce a remedy the applicant needed or desired, and the loss of green yard space to paving would be undesirable. The ZBA agreed.
