# **ZONING UPDATES**

Over the past few months the neighborhood association has had several zoning cases that were addressed by the association after careful consideration and consensus.

The latest case was regarding a fence for a corner lot that will run along the sidewalk of the side street and back up to the edge of the house in order to make a private space for the owner and his pets. There is always a difficulty with corner lots, and as there are several such fences in the neighborhood, BNA was not opposed this application, but rather provided suggestions about landscaping across the front part and the addition of an architectural top for the fence -- all things the homeowner himself was planning to do. By having attended the hearing and re-enforcing this, it became part of the record in the

decision. The fence was approved.

The other zoning issue that pops up all the time is front yard parking. This spring there was the case for a variance, by a neighbor who wanted to carve out an area of her front yard and pave it for parking purposes. The Zoning Board of Appeals unanimously denied the case, as they have done fairly consistently in regard to such applications throughout the city. One zoning Board member commented that front yard parking is never allowed.

We have a problem with this on certain streets, and we are working to bring awareness to homeowners that it is illegal and you can potentially be ticketed, be required to attend a hearing and be fined. Please don't park on your lawn. It makes your property, street and neighborhood look rundown and it depreciates your and your neighbors' property values.

Neighbors on Beresford and others have been working with the City of Rochester Zoning Department and code enforcement to resolve the issue of a mobile home parked in a driveway that spans the total distance from the house to the sidewalk. There had been misinformation, and consequently poor enforcement of our zoning code causing the issue to drag on for awhile. Now that everyone has brought the issue to the Director of Zoning and our Neighborhood Service Center, the issue will be focused on and resolved. Research of the zoning code and persistence by the neighbors made a difference.

The begonias and dusty






miller were provided by the City of Rochester and BNA. The girls did a fantastic job getting them in, and we all look forward to seeing them grow and fill in the bed with season-long color.
